Information according to Art. 13/14 Data Protection Regulation (DSGVO) regarding the production and publication of image, sound and video recordings at central events of the University of Freiburg

The protection of your personal data is of major concern to the Freiburg Institute for Basic Income Studies (from now on referred to as "FRIBIS") which is part of the University of Freiburg. That's why we want you to be fully informed about the processing of your personal data. We process your personal data (from now on referred to as "data") in accordance with legal requirements and do so in a transparent manner. With the following data protection information, we explain to you the extent to which your data is processed as a result of your participation in the event, as well as for what purposes and on what legal basis this is done.

Description of Data Processing Activity and Purpose of Data Processing

As part of its responsibilities within the Albert-Ludwigs University Freiburg, FRIBIS regularly has to inform university members as well as the the public about the fulfillment of its tasks and the results achieved. Therefore, during FRIBIS events, image, audio, and video recordings (recordings), possibly including metadata, are created.

The recordings made during the respective event serve the purpose of internal documentation of the event, media reporting on the event, as well as internal and external communication and public relations efforts by FRIBIS in connection with the respective event.

To do so some recordings are made accessible through various means of reporting. These include reporting and publication on the FRIBIS or university website, reporting in university publications and other print media (flyers, brochures, etc.), as well as distribution via social media channels (Instagram, Facebook, LinkedIn, Twitter, Mastodon), and the sending of emails, especially in the form of press releases to national and international press editorial offices for publication in print and online publications of regional, national, and international press.

Please note: The following recordings may be made by participants and other attendees of the event without consent and used for reporting:

- · recordings depicting public figures with an influence on contemporary history,
- recordings where people only appear as accessories next to landscapes or other sites
- recordings showing assemblies, parades or similar events and the nature of the respective event which the persons depicted took part in.

For all other recordings, you will be asked for consent individually unless a contractual arrangement has been made with you. Refusing to give consent or withdrawing consent does not have any negative consequences.

Legal Basis

- The legal basis for creating and publishing recordings that depict public figures, individuals incidental to landscapes or other locations, or represent the character of the event is Article 6 paragraph 1(e) in conjunction with Article 6 paragraph 3 of the General Data Protection Regulation (DSGVO) in conjunction with Section 12, paragraph 1 sentence 1, and Section 2 paragraph 9 of the State Higher Education Act (LHG)., and Section 4 of the State Data Protection Act (LDSG).
- In the context of press and public relations work, the university may also rely on its legitimate interests in data processing regarding Article 6 paragraph 1(f) of the DSGVO, unless the interests or fundamental rights and freedoms of the data subjects, requiring the protection of personal data, prevail.
- When you are asked for your consent for recordings as well possibly in addition to that your first name, last name and current area of activity, the legal basis is Article 6 paragraph 1(a), Article 7 of the DSGVO.

Information on Publications on the Internet and in University Print Materials, Regional, National, and International Press

Please note: When personal data is published on the internet (e.g., websites, social media channels), it is typically accessible worldwide by anyone. The recordings can be downloaded and used for other purposes. In such cases, the university no longer has control over the further processing or deletion of the data. We also want to inform you that in the case of a withdrawal for publication in printed materials, your request can only be considered in the next.

Duration of storage and criteria for determining the duration of storage

The recordings as well as, in case you have given a consent for other personal data (first name, last name, area of axtivity) are deleted when they are no longer necessary for the aforementioned purposes, especially when they become outdated. Recordings that have historical value or are intended for future publications (e.g., related to the history of the University of Freiburg) are stored permanently.

In the case of a contractual agreement, the recordings are deleted according to the contractually agreed-upon duration, or in the absence of such an agreement, in accordance with the information provided above.

If consent has been obtained, it can be revoked with future effect. In case of revocation, the relevant data or recordings may no longer be used for the purposes mentioned above and, to

the extent possible for the university, will be deleted instantly. Please refer to the note on publications above. In the case of printed materials, consent cannot be revoked once the printing order has been placed. The continued use of printed materials created at the time of revocation is permissible. In the event of a new edition, the recordings and any other personal data will not appear again in the respective printed material. If necessary, the recordings may be transferred to the relevant university archive and typically preserved there indefinitely

Recipients

Recipients are employees of the university who process the recordings/data as part of their official duties. Recipients are also members and affiliates of the university, press editorial offices, as well as users and visitors of the online, social, and print media of the University of Freiburg and the print and online publications of regional, national, and international press. Through the described data publication, this information may potentially become accessible to users worldwide, for example, on the internet and via social media.

Additionally, in accordance with archival regulations, all university records must be offered to the University Archives before their deletion. The archive decides on a case-by-case basis which records will be accepted.

Other recipients would only be considered in the event that we are legally obligated to disclose the data.

Your Rights

- You have the right to obtain information from FRIBIS or the University of Freiburg about the data processed concerning yourself, and/or have false data rectified.
- Under certain conditions, you also have the right to request deletion or restriction of processing, as well as data portability. Please contact <u>contact@fribis.uni-freiburg.de</u> in such cases.
- In case you gave consent for individual photos, you can withdraw your consent at any
 time. The withdrawal of consent does not affect the lawfulness of processing based on
 consent given before its withdrawal. You can also revoke your consent for the processing
 of specific data/recordings. Please contact <u>contact@fribis.uni-freiburg.de</u> in such cases.
 If you choose not to give or withdraw your consent, there will be no disadvantages. If
 consent is not revoked, it is generally valid without a time limit.
- You have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority if you believe that the
 processing of your personal data violates legal regulations. Such a supervisory authority
 may be, for example, the State Commissioner for Data Protection and Freedom of

Information on Objection Pursuant to Article 21(1) of the GDPR
